With tax filing season upon us, the Wardens have been made aware that many of the St. Olave's family have heard of, or have actually experienced scams, claiming to originate from the Canada Revenue Agency. On behalf of parishioners, their families and friends, we have printed a release issued by the CRA. The release clarifies that the CRA will never undertake the actions used in tax fraud schemes and provides contact information, should anyone experience or wish to report a tax scam. **GUEST PREACHER FOR ROGATION SUNDAY:** On May 6 we will be joined by the Rev'd Chris Harper, Indigenous Native Priest of the Diocese of Toronto. Born and raised in Saskatchewan, Chris is Plains Cree. A lifelong Anglican and the son of a residential school survivor, he studied at James Settee College in the Diocese of Saskatchewan, earning a Certificate of Indigenous Anglican Theology, before going to Wycliffe College. He was ordained a deacon at St. Thomas, Huron Street in Toronto in 2005 and priest at St. Alban's Cathedral in Prince Albert later that year. As Rogation Sunday centres on the blessings of the land, Chris will focus his sermons at 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. on the wisdom of Indigenous cultures as it relates to the land. Following the service, Chris will stay and participate in a 90-minute workshop developed by The Primate's World Relief and Development Fund called Mapping the Ground We Stand On. Your homework is to know the approximate arrival year to Canada of one of your ancestors. Join us as we learn what it's like to walk onto a map!
