UPDATE FROM ROMANIA

I am happy beyond words to have your help knowing what is happening in this period at our Day Centre for poor, marginalized children. Just before Christmas, Oana the gal in charge who is giving her heart and soul (they all are) to these most unfortunate children told me that ending the semester all the children in the grade 5 to 8 group passed their exams because of the help they are getting from us. Most of the younger children in grades 1 to 4 all have "good" to "very good" as their marks, and those who were 100% risk of being illiterate now know the alphabet and can put words into syllables. This is a success more than we could have hoped for! The children are on their way.

Another fantastic thing that happened was that Oana got the children to sing in the community carol sing evening at the village community centre.

Mrs. Codreanu who works with the older children has been preparing them well. The townspeople were very impressed by the children's talent, intelligence and courage and really applauded and encouraged them, seeing them in another way. So these children who were ignored and looked down upon are now seen differently. This is a huge joy for us! A higher estimation of themselves will lead to a belief that a life other than the hopeless one they were leading, is possible.

I'll be getting the latest about the babies in the hospital and the group homes we work in, but I just had to pass on this joy to you that we can do so much for these children that no one has cared about until now.
