DREAM TRIP TO EGYPT: Debbie Cowling will be giving an encore presentation of her fabulous slide show at the **Mary & Martha Group** meeting on Tuesday October 16 at 2:00 p.m. **Everyone is welcome to attend!**

WINDERMERE STRING QUARTET CONCERT: Sunday October 21 at 3:00 p.m. "Sacred Spaces" WSQ open space for musical reflection with two works with a religious theme. Carl Loewe's *Quatuor Spirituel*, an unusual and highly intriguing work from 1830, carries a specific program based on psalms and scripture. WSQ are looking forward to reprising Julia Mermelstein's *Echoes of Illumina* commissioned by them in 2015, which draws on a motet by Gesualdo. Mark this date in your calendar and join us for what promises to be a beautiful service.

REFORMATION AND THE PRINTING PRESS – Thursday November 1

All Saints Communion at 6 pm followed by light supper at 6:40. From 7 to 8 pm we conclude our year-long celebration of the Reformation which started in 1517, as **Dr. Pearce Carefoote** (Head of U of T's rare-book collection) explains in an illustrated talk that it couldn't have happened as it did without the invention of the printing press.
