VISITING CHOIR TO SING EVENSONG: The professional choir of St. Paul's Cathedral, London, Ontario, will be visiting St. Olave's! The Cathedral choir, under the direction of Andrew Mackriell, offered to visit our parish and to sing evensong on Sunday, October 28, (the Feast of St. Simon and St. Jude) at 5:00 p.m. They will be singing the *Truro Evening Canticles* by Philip Stopford, *There Is A Stream* by Peter Hallock, and the *Preces and Responses* by Antony Baldwin. REFORMATION AND THE PRINTING PRESS – Thursday November 1
All Saints Communion at 6 pm followed by light supper at 6:40. From 7 to 8 pm we conclude our year-long celebration of the Reformation which started in 1517, as **Dr. Pearce Carefoote** (Head of U of T’s rare-book collection) explains in an illustrated talk that it couldn’t have happened as it did without the invention of the printing press.

COMMEMORATION OF THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED: All Souls' Day is the day upon which we give thanks for the lives of our loved ones and all those who have gone before us.
