

HAVE YOU NOTICED? The Wardens are pleased to report the renovations to the Chapel are complete. Our thanks go to Sexton Dave Webb for applying a fresh coat of paint and seeing to the removal of an extra radiator, which made it possible to create some much-needed space around the pews. We also had the carpet removed and refinished the altar floor, added a smaller area rug beneath the altar and had the red velvet drape behind the altar dry-cleaned. Dave moved the altar rail out slightly to create more space around the altar and also installed a kneeler wall for the first pew. These changes will ensure the Chapel continues to be a beautiful and comfortable worship space for years to come.

PARISH BUSINESS EXCHANGE NOW OPEN: A new business card display case has been installed in the Narthex (Windermere entrance) above the table. St. Olave's is pleased to create this opportunity for parishioners and friends to advertise their services.

LENTEN SERMON SERIES: The Rector is preaching a seven-week sermon series throughout Lent. The theme of the series is the Seven Last Words of Christ from the Cross. The four Gospels record seven statements made by Jesus as he hung from the cross. The Rector will preach on each of these "words" throughout Lent. The series began on Ash Wednesday, March 6: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34); Sunday, March 10 (Lent 1): "Truly, I say to thee, today shalt thou be with me in paradise" (Lk 23:43); Sunday, March 17 (Lent 2): "Woman, behold thy son. Son, behold thy mother John" (19:26-27); Sunday, March 24 (Lent 3): "My God, My God, why hast thou forsaken me?" (Matt 27:46 & Mk 15:34); Sunday, March 31 (Lent 4): "I thirst" (John 19:28); Sunday, April 7 (Passion Sunday): "It is finished" (John 19:30); Sunday, April 14 (Palm Sunday): "Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit." (Luke 23:46).

LENTEN STUDY 2019: Our Rector is leading a study throughout Lent called, "The Prayer Book: Your Guide to Daily Living." All are invited to come for Evening Prayer at 6:00 p.m., followed by a light supper. The study session will begin around 7:00 p.m. and will conclude shortly after 8:00 p.m. Remaining sessions include: **March 20:** Hearing Sacred Stories: Reading the Bible with the BCP as our guide; **March 27:** Praying Hallowed Words: Praying the BCP outside of Church; **April 3:** Cherishing Sanctified Beliefs: Knowing the Anglican Faith preserved in the BCP; **April 10:** Seeking Blessed Lives: Forming a personal Rule of Life as described by the BCP.

EVENSONG & PREPARATION AT ST. BART'S: The practice of communal preparation for Holy Communion was widespread in Anglican circles in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. In recent years, St. Bart's, Regent Park has revived this neglected office after Saturday Evensong during Lent. If you love Gregorian Chant and wish to increase your devotion to Our Lord in the Sacrament of His Love, why not stop by 509 Dundas Street East, Saturdays at 5 p.m.? 
