A HISTORY OF PRIVATE PRAYER. Continues Friday September 20. Evening Prayer at 6 p.m., followed by light supper at 6:30. From 7 to 8 p.m., the Rev. Alexandra Pohlod presents a series on private prayer throughout history, in four weekly parts (until 4th Oct): the Early Church, the Middle Ages, the Reformation, and Today.

DAVID WILLCOCKS CENTENARY: Sunday September 29 Choral Evensong for Michaelmas at 4 p.m., with the **Choir of St. Peter's, Erindale**. Followed by Peach Tea, during which the choir's director **Clement Carelse** discusses the life of Sir David (1919-2015), whom he knew while at King's College, Cambridge. The English choral conductor, organist and composer is most famous for his work at King's, where he led the annual *Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols* (1957-74).
