#### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION EVENTS

Clement Carelse has just announced some more details of his illustrated talk on *Music of the Reformation* for September 24, following the 4 p.m. Choral Evensong service. His focus is on these composers and their works:

- Thomas Tallis (1505-85)
- John Merbecke (1510-85)
- William Byrd (1543–1623)

Clement directs the Choir of St. Peter's, Erindale for their tenth annual visit to St. Olave's. The service will be followed by a Peach Tea.

This year marks the **500th anniversary** of the launch of the Reformation on All Hallows Eve in 1517, when Martin Luther famously nailed his **95 Theses** to a church door in Wittenberg, Germany. As Clement will explain and demonstrate, it had a profound effect on the

music of the Christian church, putting a much greater emphasis on scriptural texts, ensuring that musical complexity did not obscure the meaning of the words, as well as strongly influencing the use of hymns and carols.
