MUSIC OF THE REFORMATION

After directing St. Peter's Choir at today's Evensong, **Clement Carelse** (*below*) discusses the dramatic influence of the Reformation (which began 500 years ago on 31 October 1517) on the music of the Christian Church.

It had a profound effect, putting a much greater emphasis on scriptural texts, ensuring that musical complexity did not obscure the meaning of the words, and strongly influencing the use of hymns and carols.
