Advent invites us to come and see

Rector's Letter

The Reverend Dr. Ephraim Radner as our guest preacher on the Sunday Next Before Advent. Dr. Radner is a professor of Historical Theology at Wycliffe College. As is our annual custom, we invited Dr. Radner as a representative of Wycliffe to receive a donation from our Second Century Mission Fund toward the college's Versey Wigmore Student Bursary fund.

In his sermon, Dr. Radner called us to reflect on how we, as a parish, might become better "apprentices," or disciples, of Jesus. The first disciples, intrigued by Jesus, were told, "come and see." The way the first dis-

ciples learned was to "follow Jesus around, listen to him, spend time with him, watch him, eat with him, meet his friends, and pray with him," Dr. Radner told us. And this continues to be the same way we become better Christians, even today.

Dr. Radner suggested five things we could focus on together in our common quest to follow him and be with him:

- 1. Praying together;
- 2. Obedience to Jesus;
- 3. Sharing our faith with others more deliberately:
- 4. Feeding the hungry and visiting the sick and imprisoned;
- 5. Taking-up our cross and sharing in the sufferings of Christ.

As we enter into this holy season of waiting and expectation, I think these five ways

of becoming better apprentices of Jesus could serve as a form of Advent devotion for each of us, individually and as a parish. How well are we doing as disciples?

Advent is a season in which a lot of people "come and see." They come to our children's Nativity Play, they come to our Lessons and Carols service, they come to our Christmas Eve services. They may not know what they are looking for, but something compels them to come. When they come, may they see in us a glimpse what it means to follow, to be apprentices, to be disciples of Jesus.

May this Advent season be for you and your family a time of blessings and joy.

Bishop Jenny Andison to bring Lenten Bible Study to St. Olave's

Bishop Jenny Andison has chosen St. Olave's to host a two-deanery wide Lenten study. The study is open to Anglicans and their friends throughout the Parkdale Toronto West and Etobicoke-Humber Deaneries. Her study will be instead of the previously announced Lenten study described in the season brochure.

This is a great honour for St. O's. Bishop Jenny told Rev. Rob that she chose our parish because it is in "a good location in the middle of those two deaneries" and because we "have a good parking lot," but most importantly, she wrote, because it is "a way of affirming the direction that the

The six-week Lenten Journey is titled Meeting Jesus in the Gospel of John, and is based on materials from the Society of St. John the Evangelist. *Meeting Jesus* prayer

journals will be provided.

The program brochure asks: "Have you ever wished to deepen your relationship with God? To experience a warm friendship with God? Maybe even fall in love with God – again – or for the very first time? By learning from Jesus, his human friendships, and his teachings about the God he calls 'Father,' we will discover God as One who longs for deep intimacy with each of us. ... We will take to heart the words of Jesus: 'I and the Father are one. We will find that God is not a judge, a disapproving parent, a policeman, or a taskmaster; rather God is our companion, our friend, our confidant, our beloved."

Stewardship update

am pleased to report that your For the Love of St. Olave's stewardship committee continues to make great progress towards the objectives set at the last Vestry Meeting. After much planning, we have completed three Focus Group sessions with a total of 39 attendees (plus facilitators).

Here are some of the excellent responses we received from our three questions:

1. What do you like about St. Olave's?

- Prayer Book
- Worship service, liturgy, sermons
- Music and hymns (move away from unfamiliar ones)
- Traditions
- Support to missions
- Sense of community
- Place to bring children, confirmation program
- Beautiful building

2. What are St. Olave's current and future needs?

- We need to grow the congregation.
- Need to address the structural deficit.
- We should not continue to draw from

Capital Account.

- Community outreach.
- 3. What can we collectively do about it?
 - Community outreach.
 - Make the congregation more aware of the costs of running the facility.
 - Define what is needed (givings) from each member of congregation.
 - Provide targets for givings.
 - Expand base of volunteers.
 - Talk more about the financial issues.
 - Educate congregation on all the various ways one can give.
 - Draw in more young families.
 - Transportation of seniors to and from church
 - Create a Men's Group
 - Expand service offerings (i.e.: Saturday evening)

In addition to this feedback, we also asked participants to complete a demographic survey: 34 were women and most participants were over 50. Counting all family members, there were 63 adults and 27 children (including some who are grown); 23 of the 39 respondents attend church every week, and on average, parishioners at the focus group had been coming to St. Olave's for 23 years.

Our committee continues to work towards a plan for 2018 that will be directed at transforming our giving habits and an increase in our givings.

Esteemed organist Giles Bryant joins us in January

Te are delighted to welcome one of Canada's leading organists and choirmasters, Dr. Giles Bryant, on Sunday, January 7 after our 4 p.m. Choral Evensong for Epiphany.

Just after 5 p.m., Giles will trace Anglican church music from its pre-Reformation monastic tradition, through the establishment of a Prayer Book repertoire in England, to the main forms current today in Canada's cathedrals and parish churches. He is a lifelong enthusiast for the *Book of Common Prayer* and its glorious music. His illustrated talk at the piano will focus on Tallis, Purcell, Maurice Greene, S.S.

As we conclude our series on the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, it is a fitting time to hear from Giles how the pre-Reformation traditions were retained and restored in many of the world's cathedrals, in parallel with the post-Reformation

changes which strongly influenced parish church music.

Giles was born in Weybridge, Surrey, in England, where he was a boy chorister and later the assistant organist at St. George's College. After coming to Toronto, he was organist at Grace Church on-the-Hill and later succeeded Healy Willan at St. Mary Magdalene. However, he is most noted for his 20 years as the organist and choirmaster at St. James Cathedral, where he led the famous choir of men and boys from 1979 to 1999.

Giles has given many organ recitals across Canada, as well as in England, France and Spain.

The service will be followed by an Epiphany Tea, with delicious cakes and assorted treats.
