TODAY AT ST. OLAVE'S

ROGATION SUNDAY: The three days before Ascension Day are called Rogation Days (see BCP p. 198). They are special days of solemn prayer during which traditionally the Litany was sung in procession around the parish and prayers for the farmers' fields were said. The Sunday immediately preceding the Rogation Days is always the Fifth Sunday after Easter (May 26 this year) and is commonly called Rogation Sunday. At the end of our 10:30 a.m. service today, we will be singing the Litany before heading outdoors to bless our own church garden.

We are pleased to welcome to our 10:30 service Antoinette Habinshuti, Deputy Director of Partners In Health Rwanda. PIH Rwanda is recognized for improving the health of women and girls, promoting safe childbirth, training community health promotes and saving lives through quick referrals to other health services in Rwanda. On the 25th anniversary of the Rwandan genocide, Ms. Habinshuti will share stories from the frontline of rebuilding the country. PIH Rwanda is a valued partner of The Primate's World Relief and Development Fund and is the implementing partner of its All Mothers and Children Count program. WHAT CAN DEACONS DO? Deacons are ordained ministers, but their duties and responsibilities are different than those of a priest. Deacons MAY perform baptisms; bring the pre-consecrated Bread and Wine on home visits for the sick and housebound; officiate at Morning and Evening Prayer on Sundays and week days; <u>assist</u> the priest at the Lord's Table during Holy Communion; wear a white clerical collar at any time; anoint the sick with oil; wear a coloured stole for Holy Communion, but will wear it diagonally across the chest; wear a tippet (black preaching scarf) for Morning and Evening Prayer; read the Gospel during Holy Communion; and may preach and teach. But there are some things deacons **MAY NOT** do. This includes marriages and officiating at Holy Communion. Our Curate, the Reverend Alexandra Pohlod, is currently a deacon. At some point in the future she will likely be ordained as a priest.
