### TODAY AT ST. OLAVE'S

**THE FLOWERS ON THE ALTAR** are the gift of Joan Shaw and Family, to the Glory of God, and in loving memory of her husband George.

**CANDLEMAS, Sunday, February 2** (or the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, BCP p. 266) marks the end of the Christmas/Epiphany season. Christmas Day and The Presentation are the bookends to a forty-day celebration of the incarnation of the Light of the World, Jesus Christ. St John's declaration on Christmas morning that the Light that "shineth in the darkness," has come into the world (BCP p. 106), is affirmed forty days later by Simeon's proclamation: "For mine eyes have seen thy salvation, which thou hast prepared before the face of all people; To be a light to lighten the Gentiles, And to be the glory of thy people Israel (BCP p. 22). The service for this day includes the blessing of candles, which is why this feast day is also known as Candlemas. Candles are poignant symbols of Christ light that help us through the darkest days of the year. At St Olave's, we will be blessing the candles to be used by the church throughout the upcoming year. **Parishioners are also invited to have candles that they have brought from home blessed at this same time. On arrival, please place your candles on the table at the front of the Nave.** These candles can then be returned to your home and will burn as symbols of Christ's presence where you live.

**MUSIC FOR ACCESSION EVENSONG AND BEETHOVEN AND THE VIENNESE SCHOOL:** Clement Carelse has just announced some of the music details for Choral Evensong on Sunday 9th February at 4 p.m. He will direct the **Schola** choir (previously known at *Schola Ecclesiam*), which is devoted to the authentic performance of Anglican church music. The ***Evensong Responses*** are by **Martin Neary** (b. 1940). The ***Magnificat*** and ***Nunc Dimittis*** are the settings in F by **Sir George Dyson** (1883-1964). The anthems are: ***Insanæ et vanæ curæ*** by **Haydn** (1732-1809); ***Laudate Dominum*** by **Mozart** (1756-91). Then stay after the service for our **Royal Festive Tea**, when Clement will present an illustrated feature on ***Beethoven and the Viennese School*** to mark the beginning of his 250th anniversary year. What we now call the ***First Viennese School*** of composers comprises Beethoven, Haydn, Mozart and Schubert. Clement will explore their musical influence on one another, with examples including the anthems at this Evensong. So join us at St. Olave's on **9th February** for another in our current season of special events, opening with Choral Evensong at four o'clock.

### **DIOCESAN SOCIAL JUSTICE VESTRY MOTION 2020**

On Friday, February 21 at 7 p.m. St. Olave's will hold its annual Vestry meeting. As always, we will put forward the Diocese of Toronto's Social Justice vestry motion. This year the motion is "Taking Action on Climate Change" and calls for federal action that will enable Canada to:

- meet the emissions reduction targets of the Paris Accord
- support a just transition to a low-carbon economy, particularly for workers employed in the oil and gas industries
- assist Indigenous and coastal communities and other vulnerable populations to adapt to and mitigate the impacts of climate change on their local environments.

The motion also invites parishes to commit to increasing our own efforts to lower greenhouse gas emissions, in a way that is appropriate and achievable for us. Leading up to vestry, we will be praying this Prayer for the Planet and invite you to pray:
