Current Status

- We have successfully conducted two greeter training sessions, ensuring consistency, clarity of roles, and confidence among volunteers.
- The ministry is currently coordinated by Anesu, who helps with scheduling, training, and service coverage.
- The team consists of 11 active greeters, providing coverage across services and key moments during worship.

Greeter Responsibilities

Greeters are responsible for hospitality, service flow, and practical support throughout the service, including:

- Arriving early (by 10:15 AM) to prepare bulletins and welcome congregants.
- Offering bulletins and greeting attendees warmly and respectfully.
- Providing support at entrances, including assistance with accessibility needs such as the chair lift.
- Supporting late arrivals discreetly once the service has begun.
- Assisting during the offertory collection, following established procedures.
- Supporting congregants during Communion services, including opening doors, guiding movement, and ensuring spaces are properly reset afterward
